June 21, 2011

Opening prayer and Bible study: Ivan Egnatuk Matthew 11:40-42

Present: Sarah Loomis, Sr. Warden, Cherie Riser, Jr. Warden, Joyce Connelly, Jim Cracraft, Ivan Egnatuk Jane Gilbert, Doug Ivey, Patty West

Warden's Reports: Sr. Warden Sarah Loomis discussed the installation of the stained glass windows and the need for an appropriate celebration of the windows return. Also discussed was the Search Committee's decision to decline to call the rector candidate. The search process and lack of part-time candidates was also discussed. Confidence in the committee's decision and continued good work was expressed by members of the Vestry.

The Sr. Warden also reported on a meeting with Bill Spaid and Jr. Warden Cherie Riser in regard to Trinity's search process.

Jr. Warden Cherie Riser reported on the iBelieve classes offered by Fr. Brian Coleman, rector of St. Thomas, Battle Creek. Five Trinitarians (Scott and Sarah Neubecker, Mike and Karla Love and the Cherie Riser) attended the first class. The next class will be Thursday, July 7 at 7pm.

Treasurer/financial report: Patty West, Finance Committee chair, and Ivan Egnatuk, vestry finance committee liaison, reported the budget is in good shape even though pledges are down because our expenses are also down.

The Finance Committee recommended that Trinity investments be switched to Arcadia from Merrill Lynch as a better interest rate will be realized. Ivan Egnatuk made the motion to change Trinity investments to Arcadia. The motion was seconded by Jane Gilbert and approved.

Committee Reports:

Bldg and Grounds: Ivan Egnatuk, Vestry liaison, reported that the area over the baptismal font and choir area has been cleaned and caulked. He also reported that it is time to once again re-finish the exterior doors (the choir doors and both the front doors).

The gardens need weeding and cultivating over the next weeks as Trinity is on Garden Tour July 9 & 10. A work schedule will be set-up and announcements made in the bulletin and bulletin bits.

BOM: Vestry liaison, Joyce Connelly reported the following: BOM will be selling water at the Garden tour; the Diocese has asked each parish fill a backpack with specific items for its mission project and Margi Rauth/Brown is collecting money for that project; David Begg has organized a movie showing about peace work in the Middle East and a field trip to a Pow Wow in Brooklyn, Mi.

Celebration Committee: Cherie Riser, vestry liaison, reported that plans for the celebration are going well. The Stewardship/membership committee is working with the celebration committee.

The open house, reservation only dinner, entertainment and other related events are well in hand. 150 year anniversary items will be available for purchase and committee members are researching availability of items and pricing. Publicity for the event has been scheduled.

Stewardship/membership: Doug Ivey, Vestry liaison, reported that the following events are scheduled for this summer; in June a trip to Shipshewana and the Menehoff Museum followed by dinner at the Blue Gate restaurant and in July a sail on Friends Good Will tall ship out of South Haven.

The committee is once again planning the family movies nights for the fall and winter. They will begin in October.

New business: Vestry assignments were made for Summerfest which is scheduled for Sunday, July 31. Once again the Line family will host the event at their property at the point of upper and lower Brace Lakes.

DIOCESAN MISSIONS CONTINUE

Openings are still available for the Kentucky and New Orleans missions. For these two missions, our diocese will pay for all gas directly to and from each destination and the cost of meals while at a mission.

The second week of the Kentucky Mission has openings. The dates are September 24th through October 1st. A waiting list has been created for the first week, September 17th through the 24th. This mission is run by the Episcopal Diocese of Lexington, Kentucky. It is located in the Daniel Boone National Forest. The Diocese of Lexington is one of the poorest dioceses in our nation. Cost per volunteer is \$200. The cost provides for volunteer housing and building supplies for the work week.

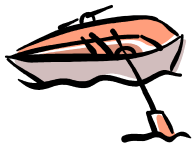

No Yelling on the Boat!

Our family took a quick trip to Papa Mike's cottage up north on Avery Lake. A family getaway to a cottage up north should be a wonderful experience for kids, full of happy memories. I grew up vacationing at my grandparent's cottage on the same lake and remembered it fondly. My grandmother would look through the trees to the lake, breathe deeply and exclaim, "This is God's country!" The Lake is surrounded by Pine and Aspen covered hills. Scattered throughout are relatively few cottages and docks. Misty mornings are often heralded by the lonely call of a loon.

It was much later in the day when we finally found the fishing gear, life jackets, sunscreen, bug spray, and keys to the boat. We grabbed a bag for snacks and in it went chips, sodas, fruit snacks, and a healthy selection of carrot sticks and sugar-free lemonade. (We would be back in time for dinner but no sense starving). We walked down to the dock with arms full and piled into the pontoon boat. The boys' smiles of anticipation quickly turned to looks of boredom when the motor took forever to start. The hot, muggy day grew hotter and apparently, no one could remember the location of the good fishing spots.

I kept reminding everyone as we trolled into the next spot, "You need to be quiet if you want to catch fish." There was a loud "THUNK" as a pole dropped on the deck of the boat, followed by an even louder retort, "I'm sorry! Did I scare the fish?" Dad then yells, "Everyone quiet down and get ready to drop the anchor!" I got up and hissed quietly, "*No yelling on the boat*" and I grabbed the anchor. While trying to be quick and quiet, I caught my leg on the sharp doorframe of the bow and yelled out in pain. Luckily, my shriek startled a loon whose call masked the rather indelicate word I yelled next. I stumbled to the bow and dumped the anchor loudly into the lake. As I turned around there were a few seconds of stunned silence. My husband was trying not to laugh and said, "Oh, so it's OK when you yell!"

Thus, the day continued and I realized while we fed worms to minnows, ate chips and loudly told each other to be quiet; that even the idyllic memories of my childhood had plenty of yelling on the boat. As a matter fact, the amount of yelling was second only to family cross-country car rides. Still it was the fun and togetherness I remembered.

You know, Jesus and his disciples spent a lot of time together in a fishing boat. I bet they ran into some loud disagreements. Of course, Jesus would keep his calm helped in no small part by the knowledge that at any time he could get out of the boat and walk to shore. However, for all their disagreements they were bound by love and common purpose, like any family.

We returned to the cottage hot, tired and fishless. The only things left in the snack bag were the carrots and sugar-free lemonade. We did go out fishing a few more times in the weekend. The outcome was no better and I notice more people coming out on their decks when we were fishing. I forgot how sound travels across the lake. Did I hear laughing in the distance?

When the time came to start the long drive home, I hesitantly asked, "What was everyone's favorite thing about Papa's cottage?" I cringed would it be the new satellite TV, the never-ending supply of food in the permafrost that is Papa's freezer, the cutesy knick-knacks of the town's gift shop, nothing?

To a person, they all answered, "The fishing." I smiled. Crisis averted; childhood memories intact.

C. Click "OK" to run the free scan.

2. Your wallet is lost or stolen. Should you file a report with the police?

A. No. The police are unlikely to have time to investigate.

B. Yes. Sending copies of the report to card issuers and credit bureaus will help clear up any ID theft.



3. The phone rings and a recorded voice tells you to call a number concerning an undeliverable package. Which area codes suggest it's a scam?

A. 284, 649, 809 or 876

B. 473, 664 or 784

C. All of the above.

4. You receive a \$4,850 check and a letter saying it's partial payment of a lottery win. You're told to deposit the check

and wire some or all of the money to the prize authority for insurance or other fees to get the full jackpot. You should:

Clicking anywhere in the on-screen alert can give your computer a virus.

ANSWER 2: B

Also alert issuers of other missing cards—driver's license, Medicare card, etc.

ANSWER 3: C

All are Caribbean codes. Scammers hope to run up your bill by \$50 or more per call.

ANSWER 4: A

You never have to pay to collect a contest prize. And the check is fake, and your bank will hound you for any money you withdraw.

ANSWER 5: D

A and B test for "skimming" devices that steal card data. C blocks prying eyes or cameras.

ANSWER 6: C

The e-mail is a scam for sure—the feds don't send unsolicited e-mails like this. If there's an issue with your tax return, expect a mailed letter.

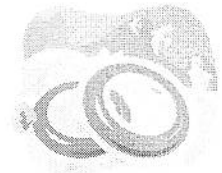
