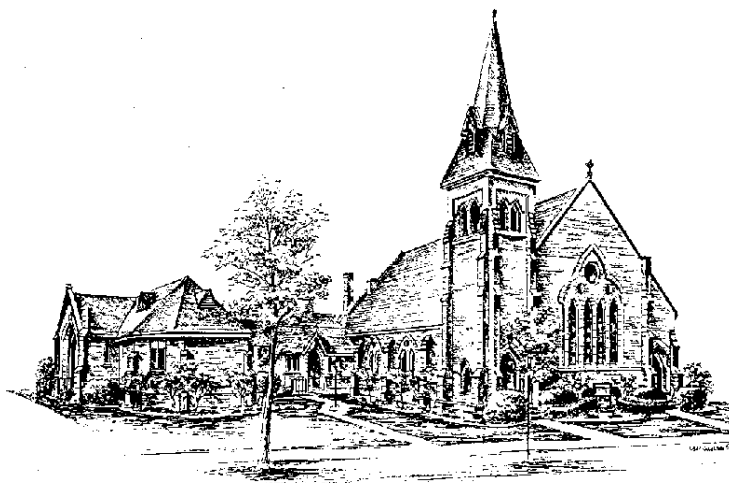

Dear Friends,

Some of you have heard me joke that for parishes and priests, the Search Process is a lot like dating. Each of us has our profiles depicting who we are and what we're looking for. The National Church offers its help through the Office for Transition Ministry, which has a website that tries to play matchmaker. Both parish and priest have hopes and dreams for the partnership they're seeking, and there's a kind of courtship, where the two meet and share their vision for the future as they seek a compatible match. Eventually, after enough time and after enough prayer, the match is made, and the relationship begins. The Bishop comes to preside over a church service to signify the official beginning of the relationship: the Celebration of New Ministry.

At our Celebration of New Ministry in January, several people commented on how much the service felt like a wedding. Many of us have joked that we're currently in "Honeymoon Mode:" everyone is completely happy with everyone else, and no one can imagine an argument or even a difference of opinion. This brings me to reflect on the time when the Honeymoon is over.

Often one hears the comment that "the Honeymoon is over" when things in a relationship have turned sour. I have always wondered why. True enough, sometimes marriages go bad, and a couple seems to move from the honeymoon to the marriage's demise with lightning speed. But it seems to me that the end of the honeymoon can also be a very good thing. During the honeymoon we are on our best behavior, and often very far from reality. Anybody who has had a tropical honeymoon far away from snowy Michigan can agree – honeymoons aren't reality. In fact, there are couples who get bored toward the end of their tropical getaway, and are eager to return to "real life" – the jobs, friends, family, and hobbies that they miss. When the Honeymoon ends, couples begin to be more real with each other, to trust that their love won't end when they become aware of each other's faults or when life throws challenges at them.

It seems to me that the Honeymoon here at Trinity is still in full swing, and let me be the first to say I'm really enjoying it! Let's remember, however, that there will come a time when life throws problems at us, or we realize that nobody is perfect. Again, this can be a very good thing! When we see each other's faults, we realize that love prevails. That love becomes a reflection of God's love for us, which is indeed stronger than our differences and our faults. We learn about each other's strengths and weaknesses, and how we as a family are made stronger by facing the challenges that come our way. Will the Honeymoon here at Trinity last forever? It's unlikely. But we should remember that the end of the Honeymoon does not mean the end of our time together. Rather, it signifies that our relationship is becoming more genuine and trusting. Our love is reaching greater depths, and our ministerial "marriage" will be better and stronger for it!

## **Minutes of Vestry Meeting of December 20, 2011**

Present: Joyce Connelly, Jim Cracraft, Ivan Egnatuk, Jane Gilbert, Doug Ivey, Sarah Loomis (Senior Warden/SW), Cherie Riser (Junior Warden/JW), Mother Anne Schnaare, Patty West  
Absent: Fran Rauth

Meeting called to order by SW Loomis at 7:05 p.m.  
Opening prayer and Bible study (Luke 2:1-20): I. Egnatuk

Minutes of meeting of November 15, 2011: Unanimously approved with minor corrections. Mother Anne agreed henceforth to make her written Rector's Report to the Vestry of her recent and forthcoming activities generally available via the parish media.

### Rector's Report:

Mother Anne reported her many activities with related thoughts for the period November 16 to December 20; report to be published, as minuted above. Notable to come is the celebration of New Ministry on Saturday January 14, 2012, which she encouraged the Vestry to treat as a major parish event. Vestry enthusiastically agreed; various plans in the works, with thanks to Jan Needham for volunteering to take charge of the special reception to follow the service. Other notable events to come include the annual parish meeting on January 29, 2012, when six new vestry members will be chosen, and the new vestry retreat, February 3-4, 2012.

### Wardens' Reports:

JW Riser reported that the wood work being done in the chancel by Denny Flynn (see Minutes of November 15, JW's Report) was well under way.

SW Loomis emphasized the importance to the parish of the January 14 New Ministry festivities, and encouraged Vestry members to volunteer their help with the reception. She also reported that there would be an Easter Vigil in 2012, and that new signage for the front of the church, paid for by memorial gifts to the parish, should be in place this spring.

### Treasurer's Report:

P. West reported out (with copies for all) both the parish book-keeper's Balance Sheet for November 2011 and the Finance Committee's projected Budget for 2012. She then led a discussion of the implications of these documents, drawing special attention to the fact that the projected 2012 deficit—difference between projected income and projected expenses—would result in an approximately \$63,000 draw-down from endowment funds (currently standing at approx. \$456,000). The discussion focused on whether, now that a rector was in place, the Vestry should move to cut expenses or to increase revenue by various means (particularly by increasing the number of pledging units and the average amount pledged; it was noted in this connection that pledges for 2011 were still down by about \$9,000, though plate income was up by nearly \$1,000; also, that promised pledges for 2012 so far exceeded those for 2011 by some \$7,000). Various scenarios were discussed. It was concluded that some mix of the two approaches would be prudent, but that any decisions in the matter should be left to the new vestry. The Vestry thanked Patty West for her report.

### Committee Reports:

The various committee representatives had little to report for the past month, except: D. Ivey announced that the Stewardship-Fellowship Committee, with Mother Anne's agreement, would propose to the new vestry that two separate committees be created to handle the often disparate affairs now being managed by the one committee. Also, J. Connelly reported that BOM earned about \$790 from its recent pie sale, and had decided on how to disperse to various charities this year's earnings. Much impressed by the amount and range of these disbursements, the Vestry urged her to publish the data in the parish media.

### New Business:

A list of eight candidates for the upcoming election of six new vestry members was finalized. It was understood that all eight had agreed to run (and so were prepared to serve), and that the new vestry—the six new members plus the three continuing ones (J. Connelly, J. Gilbert, S. Loomis)—would decide which of them would serve two years and which three. The candidates are: parishioners Margi Brown, Debbie Egnatuk, Tom Isham, Beryl Gavitt, Sue Lackey, Kurt Letzring, Phil Nager, and Scott Neubecker.

J. Connelly reported that arrangements are in process for compiling a new photo directory of the parish.

A request from the local AA to use the parish chapel-meeting room every Thursday evening at 8 p.m. was approved, on condition that AA understood that if a parish group needed the room at that time the AA meeting would move elsewhere.

Next Vestry Meeting: January 17, 2012.

Closing Prayer: Mother Anne.

Meeting adjourned at 8:40 p.m.

Rector's Report  
December 20, 2011**

Activities are ramping up as we approach the Feast of the Incarnation! I think we are starting to find a good rhythm as we explore the relationship between parish and rector. I have to admit, I'm excited about the Season after Epiphany, when the calendar will appear a little less full. As I began my time at Trinity, there were a great deal of committee meetings and welcoming events to attend. As those activities faded, they were replaced by the holiday preparations. I look forward to January and February, when I can tend to the internal life of Trinity and work with some committees more in-depth.

One more item of note: our ASA (Average Sunday Attendance) crossed the 90-person mark last week. This is very exciting, and shows that we are growing. For a few points of reference, the lowest our ASA had been in 2011 was 81, the highest had been 100 (on Jan. 9<sup>th</sup>), and the ASA right before my arrival was 87. We're making progress!

## Annual Report 2011 – Trinity Visitors

Since establishing this ministry in June of 2010, we have continued to meet monthly in an effort to better meet the pastoral care needs of our parish and community. Occasionally, when only a couple members are able to attend, we cancel an up-coming meeting. We do, however, meet on the 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday of most months, from 7 to 8 pm.

We spend the first half of our meeting sharing information on those we have visited, and how they are generally doing. Following this, we discuss whether there are other individuals in the parish or community who might desire a visit. The prayer list is often our major source of this information. However, many times people are placed on the prayer list with little or no information as to why. This is, of course, fine and to be expected. But, we would like to encourage anyone who calls the office to request that someone be put on the prayer list to, if appropriate, also make it known if the person might appreciate a phone call or a personal visit. Perhaps now that Mother Anne is our rector, this lack of information may be greatly reduced. We continue to close our meeting time by discussing a portion of our resource book, “The Gift of Presence: A Guide to Helping Those Who Suffer”, by Joe E. Pennel, Jr.

Based on the recommendation of the Senior Warden this past spring, we took steps towards doing our first group-evaluation. The results of this evaluation are summarized below:

- We decided on an open discussion of our group, rather than an individual and written one.
- The evaluation would be shared first with the new priest, then with the parish, in both the Annual Report and in a subsequent monthly newsletter for those unable to attend the Annual Meeting.
- Our major strengths are that we are available on short notice, and that we are helping to ensure that people who are hospitalized or homebound continue to feel that they are part of the church family.
- Our major weaknesses are that we often are not aware of individuals who need a visit, there does not appear to be a good and easily accessible training program for pastoral care-givers, and, until recently, we have lacked an ordained priest to help meet the more serious needs of parishioners.
- We decided we could improve our ministry by working with and learning from our new priest, by strengthening our communication system, and by continuing to pursue appropriate training.
- In an overall rating of the effectiveness of our group (on a 1 to 10 scale) we gave ourselves an average of 7. We agreed that this translated as “decent, but could be significantly improved”.

We continue to look for and to welcome new members, even on a part-time basis. As St. Paul says in the Letter to the Galatians, “Bear one another’s burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ.”

*"The Missing Charm"*

I recently found my charm bracelet. It isn't anything trendy like the Pandora types you see now. I have a nice old-fashioned one from my childhood, you know the kind, a silver chain-styled bracelet with each little, silver charm linked to it. When I wear it, I remember my dad who has been gone almost 5 years, and it comforts me.

My youngest son took an interest in the charms and I explained to him how my mom and dad would give me a new charm for special occasions; a swimmer for being on the swim team, a horse for showing horses, a 4-leaf clover for luck, a cross for confirmation, and so on. As we continued, I came across an empty link. The thought came instantly.

"Oh no, I've lost one!"

I tried not to alarm my son but I did look for it. Of course, it really was all right, things do get lost. What actually bothered me more was that I could not remember what the charm had been? It nagged at me every time I saw the empty link. It's that feeling I was missing something that I should remember.

Then one day it came to me. "It was a '#1' symbol!" I thought with relief.

Now I remember, that charm in particular had always challenged me. Dad had given it to me when I was on the swim team and, since I didn't win all my races, it embarrassed me. I recall asking my mom why he gave it to me. Her answer was simple,

"Don't you know your father loves you?"

My dad saw me as a winner even when I didn't feel like one. From that point on, when I looked at that charm, I would always try to do my best.

The nagging, empty feeling about the missing charm went away but the memory of the lesson I learned stayed with me.

All at once, I realized it's the same nagging, empty feeling I get when a busy Sunday morning causes my family to miss church. There is that initial pang of guilt that goes away, but what remains is the feeling that I'm missing something. The whole week there is a message I didn't receive...
