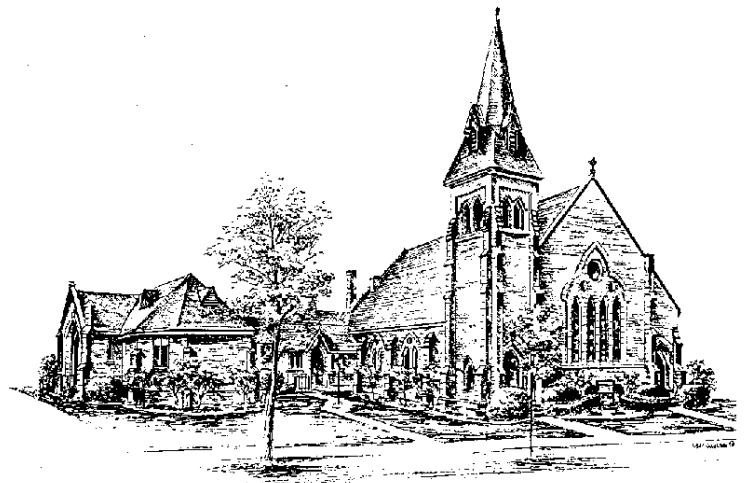

Everybody, sing with me! *It's the most- pen-i-tent time- of the year...*

"But Mother Anne," you may say, "Lent isn't until February!" Well, you're right, but I'm not talking about Lent. I'm talking about the beginning of the New Year, when we regret the indulgences of the past two months and make vows to resolutions over a new leaf. Everyone vows that this will be the year. The year to lower our cholesterol, lose that extra weight, give more to charity, read more books, and be more productive members of the workforce, all while spending more quality time with our families. We see more commercials for gyms and diet plans, and read articles about how to organize our lives.

Sound familiar?

I'd like to offer one small piece of advice, especially when it comes to the spiritual aspect of our annual makeover: Think Small. Too often we get so intimidated by big goals that we never start working on them at all. We think that if we can't spend an hour reading scripture every day, we might as well not read scripture at all. This year I'd like to suggest a different approach. At home, keep your Bible where you can see it, so when you get five or ten minutes of time, you can read some scripture. Put your church bulletin in your purse or briefcase, and reread last week's lessons or pray for the sick of our parish during your break at work. On your computer, bookmark www.missionstclare to follow links for the Daily Office readings. These tiny things will help you make the most of the time that comes your way. Thinking small helps us get moving in the right direction. It does us no good to think big, if we never move at all!

December 20, 2011

Activities are ramping up as we approach the Feast of the Incarnation! I think we are starting to find a good rhythm as we explore the relationship between parish and rector. I have to admit, I'm excited about the Season after Epiphany, when the calendar will appear a little less full. As I began my time at Trinity, there were a great deal of committee meetings and welcoming events to attend. As those activities faded, they were replaced by the holiday preparations. I look forward to January and February, when I can tend to the internal life of Trinity and work with some committees more in-depth.

One more item of note: our ASA (Average Sunday Attendance) crossed the 90-person mark last week. This is very exciting, and shows that we are growing. For a few points of reference, the lowest our ASA had been in 2011 was 81, the highest had been 100 (on Jan. 9th), and the ASA right before my arrival was 87. We're making progress!

November 15, 2011**

Meeting called to order at 7:08pm by Sr. Warden Loomis

Prayer and Devotions led by Joyce Connelly.

Minutes: MOTION (Cracraft/Gilbert) to accept minutes of vestry meeting October 18, 2011 APPROVED with correction: Worship report regarding supply clergy should read “on an irregular basis”.

Rector’s Report: Mother Anne Schnaare presented a written report.

Senior Warden Report: Sarah expressed joy at the advent of Mother Anne’s rectorship.

Junior Warden Report: Cherie reported that she has met with Denny Flynn regarding the potentially dangerous altar area step. He will work on a contrasting wood strip to make the step more visible and hence safer. She also reported they are working of finish for the outside of the doors that will be less impacted by the weather.

Treasurer’s Report: MOTION (Rauth/Egnatuk) to accept financial report APPROVED. Patty said she hoped that the final pledge figures would be in before the next vestry meeting. Mother Anne suggested that the vestry seek additional ways to generate revenue in 2012. It was also reported that the Discretionary Fund, in order to be subject to audit and still remain confidential, some procedures and methods need to be adjusted.

Committee Reports

Celebration: Cherie and Ivan have reviewed the budget of the committee and reported that some celebration items (mugs, cookbooks, decorations) have not been sold yet.

Every Member Canvas: Ivan reported that not all the pledges are in yet.

Board of Missions: Joyce reported that she has the list of our assigned families for Christmas Baskets. The information will be in the December newsletter. On Dec.17 the baskets and presents will be wrapped. The vestry tabled a discussion of the role of the Mission Council and their funds.

Building and Grounds: Ivan reported that the repair of the ceiling in the church had been completed. He also reported that due to a pump motor break-down, there had been an emergency to which the fire department responded and that the pump has now been repaired. On-going concerns: storage area in the garage, handicap seating in the church, carpet seams.

Memorials: No report

Stewardship/Fellowship: The screenings of “Downton Abbey” have been completed. No new plans at this time.

Worship: No report

Youth: No report.

NEW BUSINESS:

Vestry Replacements: Vestry members were reminded again that six replacements (some for two years) must be elected in January, and asked the present vestry members to give some serious thought and time to finding those six. Emphasis to the nominees should be COMMITMENT. New members to the Mission Council and Christian Ed Council as well as Convention Delegates must also need be elected in January

New Photo Directory: Joyce will investigate costs and possibilities.

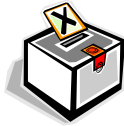


A Card Shower for Harry Thompson!

I'm sure more titles will arise but these should keep me busy for now.

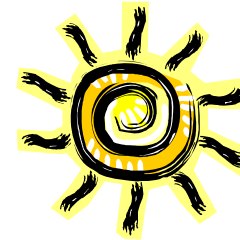
