# HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL CENTER

On October 23rd a small group from Trinity Church went to the Holocaust Memorial Center in Farmington Hills, MI. The visit was part of an on-going United in Service project called "Peace Works". This year we have been exploring the issues around the Israeli-Palestinian Conflict. The trip to the Holocaust Memorial was intended to help us understand the historical narrative that shapes the Israeli posture and perspective. Needless to say, the experience was very powerful.

The Holocaust Memorial Center is America's first museum dedicated to the remembrance to the tragic events of WWII and Nazi Germany. In a front page story The Wall Street Journal said in reference to the provocative nature of other Holocaust Museums that the Holocaust Memorial Center "may be the most provocative museum of them all." I have visited Israel's Yad Vashem, the world's largest Holocaust museum. I have also visited United States Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington, D.C. I can say without hesitation that Michigan's Holocaust Memorial ranks among the best. We spent over two hours there, and we all agreed it was not enough time. We will return, and we hope others will join us.

The tour guides are excellent and they provided a wealth of information. The exhibits are compelling in a way that drew us in. In one hall there is a facsimile of an agricultural rail car, a "cattle car" as they are often called. Our guide pressed in among a few of us, then asked us to imagine the car being so filled with people that we would all be pressed in together so tightly that there'd be barely enough room to move. It stopped us. We wanted to spread out and put some space between ourselves. We also wanted to stay, to linger and ponder.

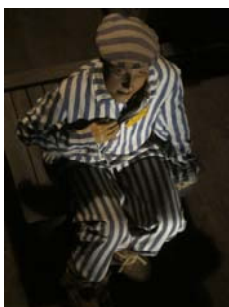
The horrors of the Holocaust are unimaginable, and yet they are terribly true. Within the story there is also great courage, even righteousness. In part, the Holocaust represents the worst in us, the worst in all of us. It also represents the best, the Light within us that can not be extinguished.

I had the boldness to step quietly into a room where an old man had just made a presentation. He was answering questions from a group of Jewish school children. His name is George and long ago he was a young Jewish boy in German-occupied France during World War Two. He told of an incident when his mother, he, and his baby sister had to cross a German checkpoint. They carried false identity papers to hide the fact that they were Jews. His mother feared the Germans would discover their papers were fake, and they'd be arrested and sent to a Death Camp. In an instant his mother conjured up a plan. "Just as we approached the soldiers", George said, "Mother pinched my sister's rump. She pinched her very hard using her finger nails. She pinched so hard the baby bled, ... and screamed". His mother told the soldiers her baby was very sick. "The baby will get worse if she is not given medicine immediately", his Polish born mother explain in perfect French. She quickly flashed the false identity papers and told the soldiers, "I have my papers as you can see. Please let me go over there and give my baby her medicine. That will calm her down. Then I will come back and give you the papers". The soldiers agreed and they let her go. George, his mother and sister never looked back. They just kept going.

George later told the group of young students. "I saw many things. People abducted and beaten. I saw women and girls raped. I saw people killed. I saw things too horrible to tell you. Things I will never forget".

We too will remember. That's the point of the Memorial. Tragically, horrible things are still happening in the world today. Genocide is still an evil that exists in places like Darfur. We should not look away.

The Holocaust Memorial Center is not a fun time. In some ways it is not an easy trip to take. Nonetheless, we're going back. We have not set a date yet, but when we go you are invited to join us. 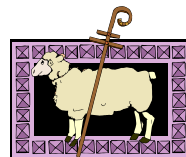
Dear Folks at Trinity Episcopal,

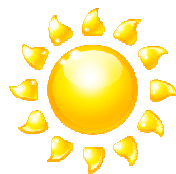

**Parish the Thought:** A note from Julie

Well, I would love to tell you about Mother Anne. I could probably go on and on with all the reasons why I like her but I won't!

Instead, I will tell you how our backyard farm has changed this year. A little journey Todd and I call, "Two Goats Why?"

Early this spring, our family bought two little male Alpine goats. *No, we don't intend to milk them. (Seriously, I've been asked that!)* In answer to my mother's question above, we simply got them as an easy mowing and brush-clearing alternative. Little did we know what we were in for.

Munch and Chewy, as we called them, were bottle feed twice a day. They would run up to us tails fluttering with anticipation, empty their bottles in seconds, and then start on any loose clothing they would notice. They grew very fast and soon enjoyed running loose outside their pen. They follow us now from one location to the next. Contrary to popular belief, goats don't eat everything. As they walk along, they taste everything. Although they react to the word "No" it can't be said fast enough. A simple walk past a prized sunflower leaves it a half moon of its once glorious self. A strip of duct tape almost disappeared like a spaghetti noodle. Luckily, a snort and a "PHTEW" sent it flying.

One nice thing I found is they eat the clover first. I spent a few lazy days weeding my flower gardens this summer as they nimbly ate the invasive wildflowers. Of course, you have keep track of them because once the clover is gone precious pansies are next.

Goats are incredibly nimble and can leap and climb easily. Munch, the smaller of the two, is especially gifted. With just a hop and a skip he is at the top of a 6ft retaining wall, looking down. Just as fast, he can leap up, out and down to the second tier of the wall landing deftly with his feet in line on the narrow edge. I swear I heard a "Ta-dah!" as he stood with his head raised high. His antics have earned him the title of "Air-Munch".

Chewy on the other hand is not so nimble but he is the powerhouse of the two. They were running around like crazy little goats and butting head as goats do. One of them had the thought to rear up and the other naturally followed, the inevitable head-butt jarred even Todd and I as we looked on. Munch froze on all fours, let out a long bleat and tipped over onto his side, out cold. Horrified I froze. "Is he dead?" I almost couldn't ask. Then before we could make a move, Munch was up, staggering, and quickly moving to the nearest patch of clover. Chewy let out a snort and ran to share the same patch. They haven't hit that hard head-on since.

Still, they are best of friends and mischief-makers. Now in autumn, I use them for "raking" leaves. Who would have thought they would go after dry leaves like taco chips?

Goats are one of the most silly and jubilant creatures God has ever made. As they jump and spin with abandon, they are the embodiment of pure joy. No wonder we call our own precious children, "kids".
