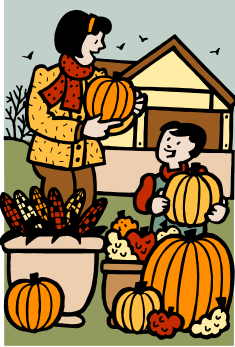
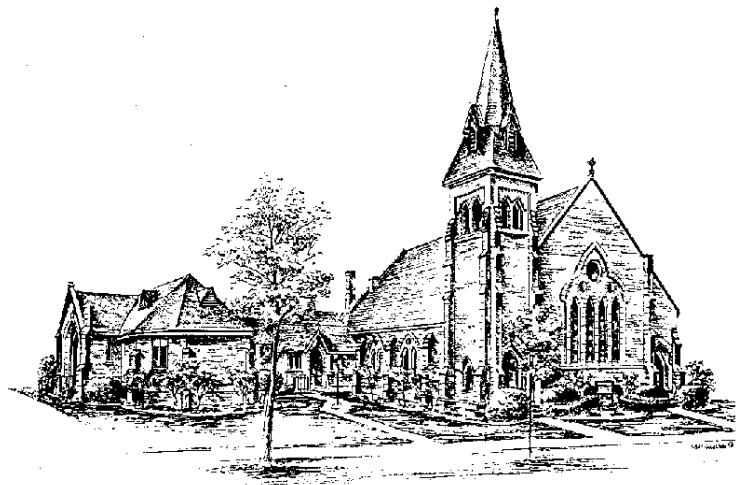

Meeting called to order at 7:06pm by Sr. Warden Loomis

Prayer and Devotions led by Sarah Loomis.

Minutes: Motion (Egnatuk/Gilbert) to accept minutes of July 20, 2011 accepted with correction of 2010 to 2011 in heading. Approved.

Junior Warden Report: Cherie reported that the "I Believe" classes are going well. The last class will be on 9/6 in Battle Creek.

Senior Warden Report: Sarah Loomis thanked everyone for the success of the Summer Fest. She announced that she will be in California September 9 through 19, during that time Cherie will be in charge. She also commented on the dedication of the reinstalled windows last Sunday.

Treasurer's Report: Ivan and Patty commented on the budgets presented to the vestry. Finance Committee will meet in September to start forming the budget for next year. PINE RIDGE EYE CLINIC

I felt fortunate to serve as a volunteer with the Lakota Vision Clinic that was held on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota. The Pine Ridge Indian Reservation is one of the poorest areas in the United States and the need for support is immense. The Episcopal Church has played an important role on the Pine Ridge since the creation of the reservation. This project, like the West Michigan Diocese's mission trips, are helping revive Episcopal involvement with the Oglala Sioux.



The group that sponsored the clinic is called 'We're All God's Children' and they are based in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Their team consisted of 10 people. This was their fourth year of conducting eye clinics on Pine Ridge. Their first clinic was held at the Porcupine Health Clinic in 2008. Beginning the next year clinics have been held at local schools which has made the free services accessible to more people.



The team distributes used eye glasses, **including glasses donated by Trinity Episcopal Church**. Volunteers are taught how to find the right glasses for the clients. We searched through the inventory looking for their prescription, then had the client try on the glasses to confirm they were a proper fit and they could see clearly. Sometimes the process only took a few minutes, but other times it could take up to an hour. Free clinics were held at the schools in the villages of Pine Ridge, Porcupine, Oglala, and a mission near Scenic.

Our days started early, usually around 7:30am. A typical day included driving to the clinic site, setting up the equipment and supplies, having a group devotion, and singing the Cherokee Morning Song (the team leader is Cherokee). Then teachers would start bringing the children and adults in! It was a bit overwhelming at times as we tried to fit everyone with glasses before they had to leave. We worked until 4:00pm and then had to pack everything back into the vehicles. A debriefing was held after we finished loading the vehicles.

We helped children, adults, school staff, and even a few people at the hotel where we were staying. It was a wonderful experience to watch people who could not see clearly get a big smile on their face when we found a pair of glasses that worked for them. I was humbled by one Lakota elder named Rose. I worked with Rose for about a half hour and could not find any glasses that matched her prescription. She looked at me and said "There are still a lot of children waiting to get in here for glasses. I will just go." I told her that she was just as important as they were. A few minutes later I was able to find a pair of glasses that worked for her! The smile on her face was priceless and something I will never forget. Hers was just one story. During the five days of clinics approximately 500 clients were served.

Thank you for supporting this important health care outreach program. You can help us expand Episcopal support for these free clinics with donations of used prescription eye glasses, new and used sunglasses and readers, and gently used books.

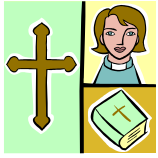

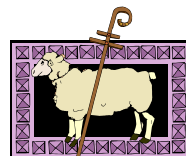


**There is some exciting

In addition to the permanent exhibits we will see the special exhibit, *Secret Heroes: The Ritchie Boys*, that recounts the WWII story of Jewish men who escaped Nazi Germany and returned with U.S. soldiers in a Top Secret mission.
